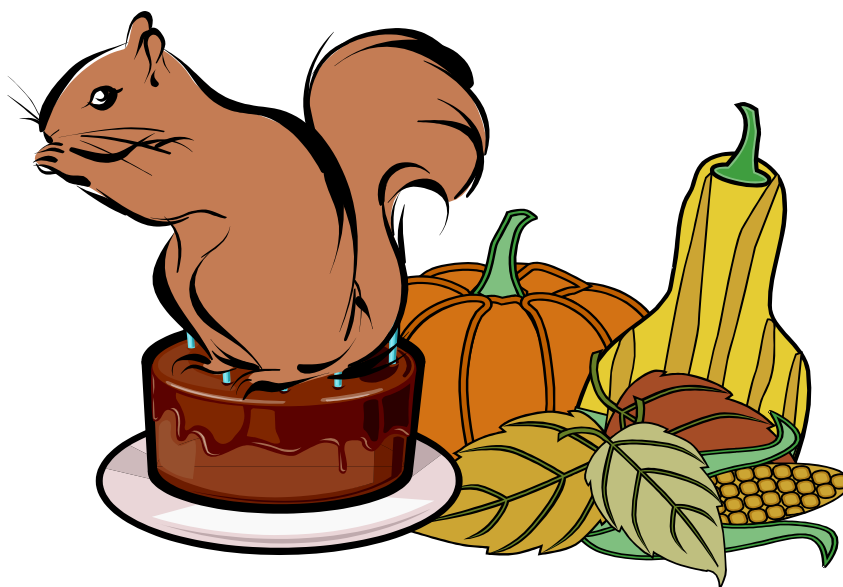

ENTRY RULES

- 1 Entries are welcome from residents of, and members of clubs and groups based in, Dunkerton, Tunley, Withyditich and Carlingcott
- 2 Two entries may be made in all classes. Only one entry per class will count towards points for trophies
- 3 Exhibits must be *bona fide* produce of, or grown in ground occupied by, the exhibitor
- 4 Entries must not have been exhibited in this show previously.
- 5 Judges' decisions are final.
- 6 The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to exhibits but every reasonable care will be taken.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

- 1 Entry fee 40p per class. Junior classes free. For more Entry Forms either photocopy, email mdegrev@btinternet.com or ring Max Crofts 07831 370353
- 2 Entry forms can be posted in the Hall letterbox at any time or brought to the Hall between 6.30pm and 8.30pm on the evening before the Show. Late entries will be accepted (space permitting) subject to a 60p entry fee
- 3 Exhibits are to be arranged in the Hall between 9.00am and 11.30am on the show day and left until after the presentation of prizes at 4.00pm.
- 4 Exhibits remaining at 4.15pm will be sold by auction unless the stewards have been informed that the item is not for auction.

HINTS FOR EXHIBITORS

ROSES

Good colour, less than fully open (will continue to open during the day)

BLOOMS OF ONE VARIETY

Ideally the same size

VASE OF MIXED GARDEN FLOWERS

If you use any foliage, it must be restrained!

FLOWERING SHRUBS

Attractive looking, good flowers and foliage

POT PLANTS

Clean and healthy, good foliage

APPLES

Free from blemish, uniform size, colour and shape

TOMATOES

Healthy green calyx (left in place), uniform size, colour and shape

POTATOES

Clean, free from blemish, uniform size

ONIONS

As ripe as possible, good colour

BEETROOT

Medium size, free from white rings in centre

BEETROOT/CARROTS

Should have leaves removed leaving 3ins of stalk

RUNNER BEANS

Straight as possible, young and tender, same size

CHUTNEY

Plastic or plastic coated metal lids should be used

JAM

Include a waxed paper disc cover

HOME PRODUCE

Cling film recommended

AGE...

...will be taken into account when judging Junior Classes

TROPHIES AND PRIZES

- 1 Prize Cards will be awarded in all classes, plus cash prizes in the Junior classes: 1st – 50p, 2nd – 30p
- 2 Points will be awarded for the Trophies and Prizes: first prize 5 points, second 3 points, highly commended 1 point
